Drills

- Drills are an essential part of any uniformed group as they help to instill discipline within cadets and promote camaraderie among them.
- Types of drills also include baton and rifle drills. Drills are important in parades such as the National Police Annual Parade (NPAP) as well as the National Day Parade (NDP) both of which cadets are able to participate in







Campcraft

- The outdoor component NPCC, which consist of Tent-pitching, pegging, knot and lashings and how build a flagstaff.
- A bi-annual campcraft competition is held to test cadets on their campcraft knowledge as well as give opportunities to bond and work together.





Police Knowledge

- Policing is an important part of NPCC, we learn skills such as Crime Scene Investigation (CSI), Police Procedures, road Safety and many more.
- We are also able to visit Neighbourhood Police Centres(NPC) and other Police Establishments. A highlight of activities include shooting the .22 revolver





Other activities in NPCC

Other than the first 3 fundamentals of NPCC, other activities such as Camps, Parades, Enrichment courses, Competitions and even overseas learning journeys are also available for cadets to participate in. These activities not only aid the advancement of cadets in the CCA but also offer vital Learning experiences for them.







Parades

During a cadets journey in NPCC, he or she is able to participate in various parades such as NPAP and NDP. These Parades offer a chance for cadets to use the drills taught in training and a opportunity for cadets to interact with people from other units







Enrichment courses and learning Journeys

- Examples of enrichment courses they can attend include Kayaking, first aid and many more. Policing courses such as unarmed tactics and revolver handling help cadets to familiarise themselves with police procedures.
- Learning Journeys to Neighbourhood Police Centre NPCs and SCDF Bases





Camps

Within the school there is annual unit camp for 3D2N, where cadets are able to interact and bond with seniors and juniors as well as have the opportunity to thank the seniors for their hard work in the CCA. Outside of school, there is an Adventure Survival Training Camp(ASTC) at Pulau Ubin where cadets were able to interact meet people from other units. Through these camps, they can not only forge bonds, but also learn values such as resilience and teamwork







Competitions

- Examples of Competitions cadets can participate in include inter-unit drill Competition, Campcraft Competition, 0.22 revolver shooting competition and sports competition such as Area Games Day.
- These competitions allow cadets to utilise what they have learnt in actual scenarios and compete against each other



Overseas Learning Journeys

- Cadets are also offered to travel overseas to learn how the police operate in other countries. It is also a time for cadets to meet new people overseas and from other school as well as give back to the community in the visiting country.
- Some countries include Brunei and Hong Kong. Although due to the travel restrictions it is unlikely
